



FAMILY READING FUN FOR KINDERGARTEN -2CD GRADE STUDENTS

Write! Make an alphabet book with your child. Start with a blank notebook or group of pages and have your child draw pictures of the letters of the alphabet on each page. If needed, draw them an example of the letter to get them started. Flip through the book with your child and start learning the alphabet!

Create! Start a home library or bookshelf with your child to show them how important books are for your family. If your child has books of their own and they are arranged in a special place within the household, it will boost the chances they will read on a daily basis.

Connect! With your child, say out loud two names for an animal, and ask your child to choose the name that begins with the same sound as the animal's name. Ask, for example, should a horse's name be Hank or Tank? Should a pig be Mattie or Patty? Should a zebra be Zap or Cap?

Play! If your child has a poem or short story that he/she especially likes, ask him/her to act it out. When acting, ask your child to make faces in order to show the way the character in the story is feeling. Making different faces will add emotion to the performer's voice. After the performance, praise your child for doing a good job.
